PROGRAMME 2020/21




















MOVIE SUMMARY 2020/21

Darkest Hour 2017

The Birds 1963

L'Asencion [The Climb] 2017

Green Book 2018

When Tony Lip, a bouncer from an Italian-American neighbourhood in the Bronx, is hired to drive Dr. Don Shirley, a world-class Black pianist, on a concert tour from Manhattan to the Deep South, they must rely on "The Green Book" to guide them to the few establishments that were then safe for African-Americans. Confronted with racism, danger-as well as unexpected humanity and humour-they are forced to set aside differences to survive and thrive on the journey of a lifetime. US

The Farewell 2019

The push and pull between the bonds of blood and the ties of culture are explored with a light touch and a perceptive eye for detail in this delightful, semi-autobiographical family drama/comedy from writer and director Lulu Wang. US
