



OSCA HONORARY LIFE MEMBER

Criteria

1. Duration of at least ten years of service in the OSCA environment. Exceptional commitment of shorter duration may warrant Honorary Life Membership.
2. Holding senior positions in OSCA and its affiliated clubs and societies (President, Vice-President, Captain), and involvement in the organization of those entities over a substantial period.
3. Involvement across various positions or entities within the OSCA structure would enhance the prospect of selection.
4. Involvement in other Scotch College positions or entities including the School Council and Scotch Foundation.
5. Honorary Life Membership may be automatically bestowed following service in certain roles such as Principal or Vice Principal of the school and Executive Director of OSCA, provided the duration of the appointment is sufficient, and the individual remains in good standing with OSCA.
6. Whilst all aspects are important, it is the unique contribution of the member that should stand as the most important criteria. The recipient will have contributed in a way that has significantly progressed the Association and its causes.

PROCESS

1. Each nomination requires a Proposer and Seconder, both being OSCA members as per OSCA Constitution.
2. Nominations must be received by the Executive Director by August 31st each year. The Nominations Committee at his/her discretion may, in exceptional circumstances, consider a late nomination provided it can be considered by the OSCA Nominations Committee at the appropriate meeting.
3. The Executive Director will assess the nominations and present valid nominations to the OSCA Executive for consideration to be formally ratified by the OSCA Council.
4. Honorary Life Member Awards are presented at the OSCA Annual General Meeting and President's Dinner in November.
